  - a. Hydro Account Update Thornton Arena

The Manager of Parks and Recreation provided Council with an update on the hydro account at the Thornton Arena, advising that a live meter read was recently performed due to inaccurate meter estimates. The live meter read resulted in a credit of approximately \$18,000.00.

# b. Official Plan Review Progress Update – Virtual Open House February 23, 2021

The Manager of Planning and Development informed Council and members of the public that a Virtual Open House was scheduled to take place on February 23, 2021. The intent of the Open House is to review Draft Discussion Paper No. 1 which will assist with summarizing comments received by the municipality and identify areas of priority for the Official Plan Review.

# c. 2021 Water and Sewer Fees

The Manager of Public Works informed Council that staff is planning to proceed with new 2021 Water and Sewer Fees based on the recommendation contained in the Water Financial Plan submitted by Sharratt Water Management Ltd. which was accepted by Council on December 16, 2020. A By-law will be presented to Council to amend By-law 2019-18.

# d. Water / Wastewater Expenditures (2020)

The Manager of Public Works informed Council that an overage in expenditures occurred in 2020 as a result of emergency repairs that were required at the Wastewater Treatment Plant. He advised that he will be evaluating the priority items contained in the approved 2021 Water / Wastewater Budget in an effort to bridge the gap. Invoicing was only just received from OCWA which brought this to our attention but going forward they will be invoicing more regularly.

# d. Angus Arena Ice

The Manager of Parks and Recreation advised that he will be bringing a report forward at the next meeting in respect of ice rentals at the Angus Arena once the Province has provided direction to municipalities and user groups in respect of the COVID-19 Orders. As of right now, the cost to maintain the ice is minimal.

# e. Correspondence from Jim Wilson, MPP Simcoe-Grey, re: Small Business Community

Mayor Macdonald informed Council that she was in receipt of a letter from the office of Jim Wilson, which supports the business community in Essa Township. The letter will be provided to the Clerk and placed on the upcoming Consent Agenda for Council's meeting of February 17, 2021.

#### BY-LAW 2021-07

A By-law for the imposition of fees for Water and Sewer Service [Repeals By-law 2019-18].

WHEREAS Parts II and XII of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, permit municipalities to enact by-laws imposing fees for various services or matters; and

WHEREAS Council deems it advisable to establish fees for water and sewer services; and

WHEREAS at its meeting of December 16, 2020, Council of the Corporation of the Township of Essa passed resolution CW164-2019 to approve the Drinking Water and Wastewater System Rate Report as prepared by Sharratt Water Management Ltd and in effect authorized a rate increase effective January 1, 2021 for 2021, January 1, 2022 for 2022, January 1, 2023 for 2023, January 1, 2024 for 2024, January 1, 2025 for 2025;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of the Corporation of the Township of Essa hereby enacts as follows:

- 1. That Schedule "A" attached hereto sets out the fees for 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024 and 2025 for water and sewer services and forms part of this By-law.
- 2. That By-law 2019-18 be and is hereby repealed.
- 3. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2021.
