The Manager of Public **VV**orks spoke to this. The committee agreed Tatham outlined a great guideline for the **Pro**'s and Con's of different traffic calming devices, as well as best utilization of different devices.

5.2 Line Painting – Zebra Crossing

The Zebra Crossings pavement marking that have already been placed have had a great response from residents and motorists. The committee has received requests for additional crossings through-out the community. The Committee will be looking into the request along with budgetary restrictions.

5.3 Staff Report CAO O35-21 – Speeding Enforcement

The Chief Administrative Officer spoke to this. Council has approved additional funding for policing throughout Essa Township for speed purposes. The Committee will be compiling speed information to address specific areas of concern.
