STATUS OF RESERVE ACCOUNT

RECOMMENDATION

That Report #PSB-2020-04 be received.

OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on the reserve account established in 2007.

BACKGROUND

On November 29, 2007 the Board passed a resolution to transfer excess revenue over expenditures to a reserve at the end of each year to fund future Board budgets. The municipal Councils approved the establishment of a reserve account that would fund the Board with no cost to the municipalities.

The Board has funded the acquisition of numerous enhancements through the reserve account totalling more than \$100,000.00. Some examples include mobile workstations, bicycles and equipment for bicycle patrol unit, exercise equipment, furniture for soft interview room, outdoor storage unit, speed monitoring equipment, weigh scales, laptop for Incident Commander, speed signs and community trailer. The Board also transferred \$105,000.00 to the municipalities when the Provincial Government amended the 1,000 Officers grant that resulted in a shortfall in municipal budgets.

The chart below provides a summary of the account since it was established in 2008 using the
excess of revenue over expenditures from 2007.

COMMENTS AND CONSIDERATION

The Board authorized the purchase of new furniture for the interview room and a community trailer in 2019 to be funded from the reserve.

The pandemic resulted in the cancellation of most events in 2020 that would have been patrolled by paid duty officers resulting in a savings in the Community Safety account. The fundraiser hockey games between the OPP and secondary schools have been cancelled for 2020 as well.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The December cash deposit in the amount of \$3,470.50 was posted in January 2020 which resulted in a reduced total in the reserve account for 2019. This deposit will be reflected in the 2020 revenue. In addition, the Chair was not paid for two (2) meetings he attended in 2019 which has been corrected in 2020.

A summary of 2019 revenue and expenditures is attached for your reference and as backup for the calculation of the year end transfer to the reserve account for 2019. Also attached is a forecast for 2020 estimating the expenditures to December 31, 2020 and the approximate amount to be transferred to the reserve account at the end of 2020.

ice Protocols 3.

3.1 Sandie expressed that user groups are grateful for the opportunity to utilize recreational spaces and happy to follow protocols.

3.2 The Parks and Recreation Department is working with the Health Unit, continuing to change protocols as times change. Most recent changes to the protocols were made to allow users to enter right up to the start of their rental as opposed to only up to 10 minutes before. It has been challenging but the department is taking all possible measures to work with the community.





6.2 Canoe and kayak launch - has been deemed necessary and would improve our economic development and tourism. The project is not as simple as originally planned. NVCA has authority over the area, we are still seeking approval from the Ministry of Natural Resources and other governing bodies over this area for approval to proceed with the project. The response from these organizations has been slow to non-existent. We need to make sure we are in compliance with all governing bodies. We will be requesting additional funds to ensure that we can comply. There will be a significant increase from the originally proposed \$7,200 for launch. The trail has been created and area is currently being used on a "use at own risk" basis. Encouraged to reach out to MPP to get a push on the project.

6.3 Motorized boats are banned. It is too dangerous to bring them down the slope to the water. Often people are fishing at the bottom. No wakes are allowed from Angus to Wasaga beach.

6.4 Bob Geddes Playground -installation has been delayed by two weeks as parts are on back order. The parts on back order are essential for the installation. Monday October 26th is the new installation date. They wanted to push it into November but it was expressed that that was unacceptable.

6.5 Michael St Park – Follow up- The Park is 30 years old, We cannot modify or add to the play structure. The new structure would cost approx. \$15,000. Lots of young families around that use the park it is in need of an overhaul.

6.6 Parking lot at Bob Geddes – This project was deferred from Covid to help offset expenses but will look to put back in 2021 budget.

6.7 Dump truck —It should be possible in 2021. We have a tractor but no truck for snow removal. This truck would bring us one step closer to having more in house services (i.e. snow removal) our staff do a better job, pay better attention to detail and have a higher standard when it comes to comes to services like this and we would like to bring a lot more of our contracted services in-house.

6.8 Gym wall divider – Delayed several weeks due to a structural engineer required to sign off on the project. This will ensure compliance and reduce liability factors.

6.9 Pickle Ball is on the rise, it has been requested to have more outdoor courts. Sandie spoke to concerns of vandalism

6.10 Jason Explains booking procedures.

7. Vandalism - Community Park (Costs, other vandalism costs, what is being done to prevent)

7.1 The vandalism at Community Park took place back in December 2019. The company delayed the project by 6 months, we cancelled our contract with them and went with a local company. Estimated total damages of \$29,000. 2021 Budget looking at cameras.



7.2 The outdoor arenas require paint for the walls to cover up the vandalism spray painted on them, there is also glass broken regularly from vandalism. Looking at an option to fence 1 outdoor arena (pending costs).

8. Open Discussion

8.1 Concerns with students not wearing masks and adhering to physical distancing while visiting stores in the plaza next to the high school.

8.2 Covid concerns for Halloween – Not a high risk activity. We do not have the ability to say no to Halloween, all three levels of government are saying it's safe.

8.3 New Tecumseth delivered picnic tables to local schools to promote outdoor learning, we have followed suit. Essa Township has brought some over to Baxter and are waiting to hear back from other local schools.

8.4 Traffic advisory committee – Many good reviews, signs go out in May until end of the school year. Doing a full traffic count eventually. One took place on Cunningham Dr. in Thornton after seeing results a speed bump was installed. Speeding is a big concern in the area

8.5 Fishing has been super busy this year. Waste receptacles being emptied more regularly. We have contracted a new company, the smell is extreme when going too long before emptying.

8.6 Looking to call another meeting before Dec 31, after budget has been curated, if schedules and times permit. Wednesday's typically work best (off week from council).

8.7 Compliments to parks crews regularly cleaning splash pads, community is grateful.

8.8 Council is blessed to have such a dedicated team of staff.

8.9 Meeting ended by the Mayor at 6:57pm.
